# 2020 4-H Animal Science Programs Report

During a year in which the lives of youth were turned upside down, providing little sense of normalcy, 4-H continued to deliver the quality programming that families have come to depend upon. The 4-H community rallied to ensure that members still had the opportunity to participate in annual 4-H animal science projects, events, and activities - even during the height of the COVID-19 Pandemic. In-person meetings, clinics, animal shows and the market animal auction were all offered virtually. Although conducted remotely, these online platforms incorporated significant hands-on opportunities enabling 4-H'ers to work directly with their project animal(s). 4-H'ers fed, cared for, groomed, trained, exhibited and sold their animals like any other year!

4-H families embraced the challenges, obstacles and uncertainties brought on by the COVID-19 Pandemic. In fact, 4-H animal science program participation was higher than expected and in many instances, exceeded that of a normal year. This can be directly attributed to three factors identified by participating families:

- 1) 4-H was one of the few youth organizations that continued to provide creative and engaging programming during the pandemic.
- 2) 4-H conducted programming that incorporated an abundance of hands-on, screen-free, learning opportunities for the whole family.
- 3) 4-H provided opportunities for youth to establish structure and normalcy in their lives through their participation in animal science projects.

There is no doubt that 4-H'ers participating in the 2020 4-H animal science programs worked harder, put in longer hours and persevered through more adversity than any other year. As their reward, each gained the characteristic "grit" enabling them to better cope with, manage and overcome adversity in their lives.
