The Minor, But Important, Spring Flowering Bulbs

Under no circumstances should this group of bulbs be considered minor just because they produce their best "show" when planted in large numbers. The many different types available, the sequence of bloom (if properly selected) from March through July and their ability to multiply and spread without special care make minor bulbs a welcome addition in any landscape.

Like many of the traditional major spring bulbs, small bulbs have many uses - border, bedding, naturalizing, accent, rock gardens and containers.

The following minor bulbs are all extremely adaptable to Long Island's growing conditions and should be readily available for purchase in retail garden centers or mail order catalogs for fall planting.
