FOR EACH PAGE

Required:

- Photograph(s)- showing stages of growth is a plus
- Common name
- Brief description
 - Size & Zones
- Recommended growing conditions

Optional- but encouraged:

- Scientific Name
- Why you chose this plant
- Do you grow or plan to grow this plant
- Interesting facts
- Anything else you want to include

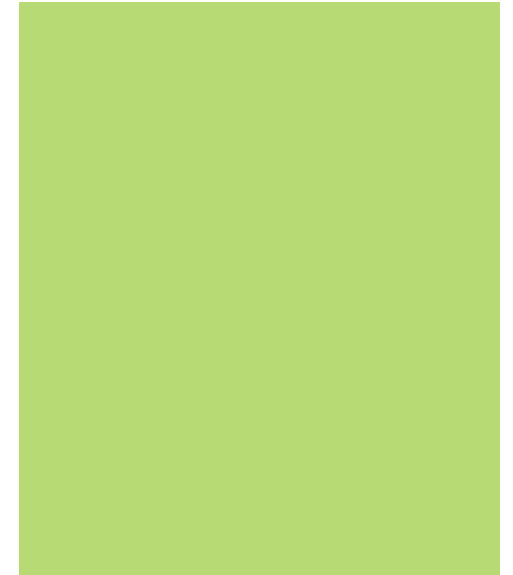
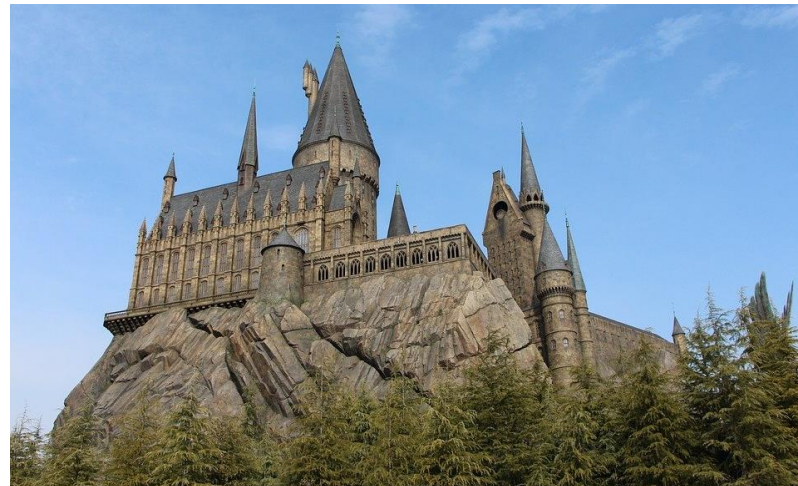

THINGS YOU'LL NEED

Plant Pictures- can be from

- Garden catalogs
- Photographs you took
- Drawings
- Photocopies

Scissors, tape/glue/tape runner, colored pens or pencils

Paper- (8 ½ x 11), variety of colors

Binder and Page Protectors





LOOK THROUGH CATALOGS CUT OUT PHOTOS

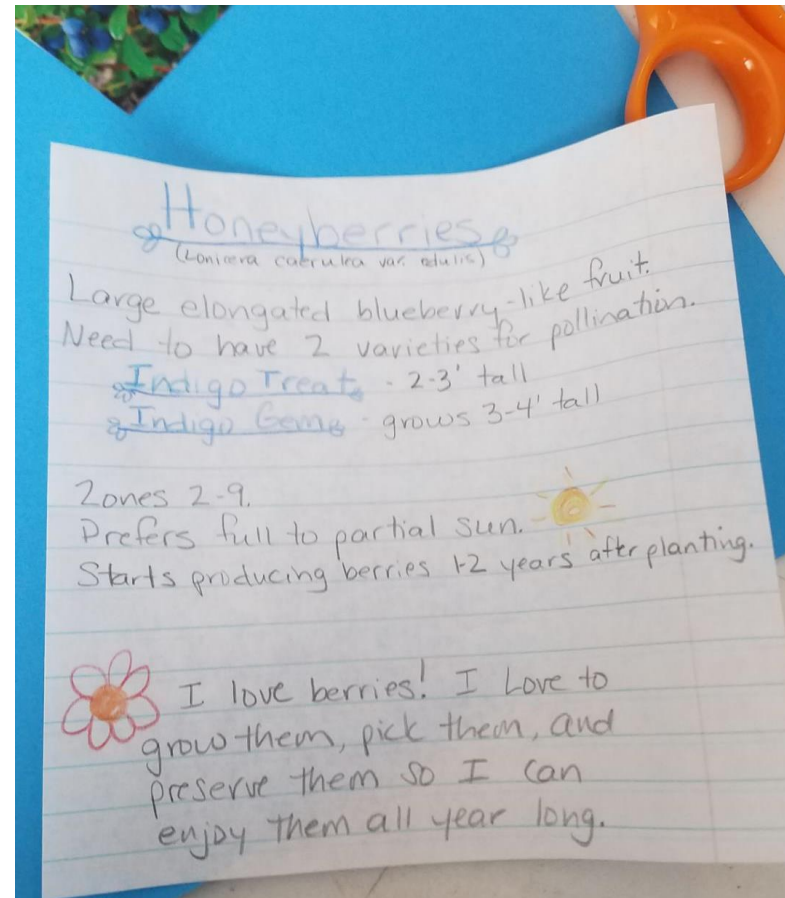
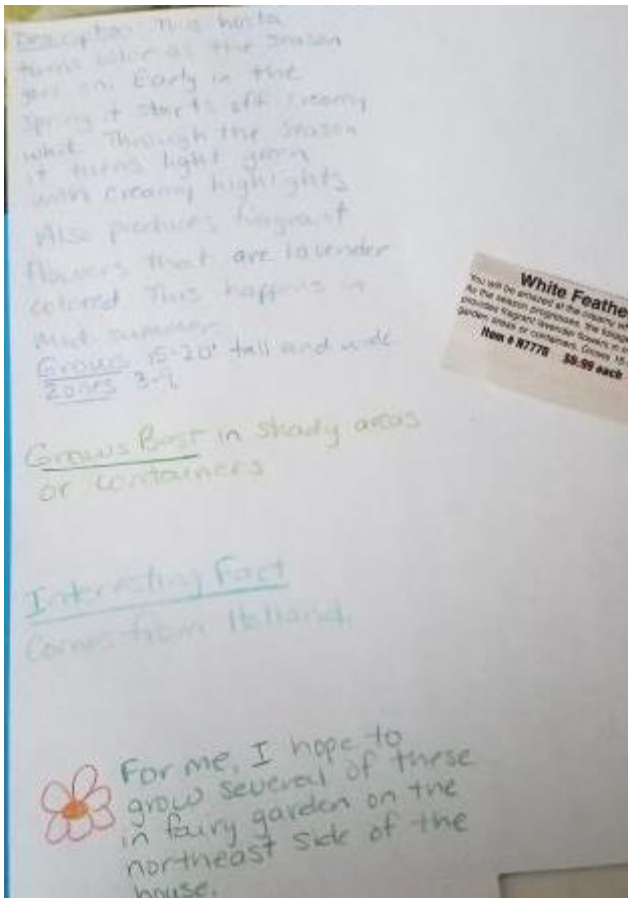
First do a rough cut of anything that you find interesting

Include the plant information when cutting

Notice both sides of the page before you cut

Sort into groups- flowers & indoor plants, fruits & nuts, ornamentals and vegetables

If cutting from more than catalog, try to keep them organized



TRANSFER INFORMATION

Handwritten or typed is OK

Common Name of plant

-can include scientific name too

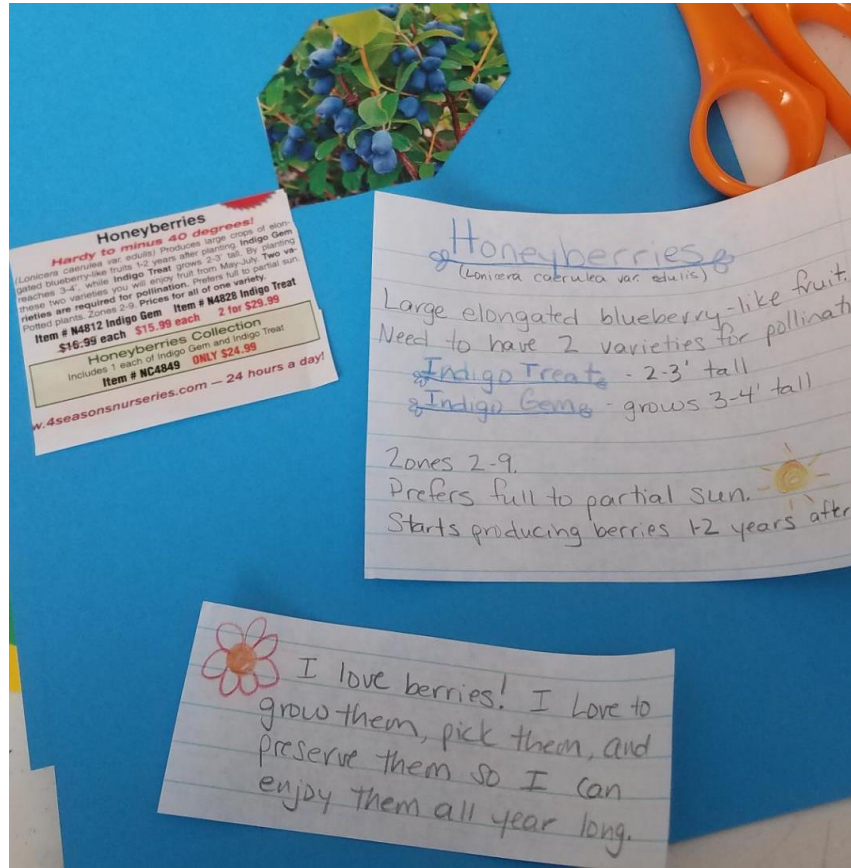
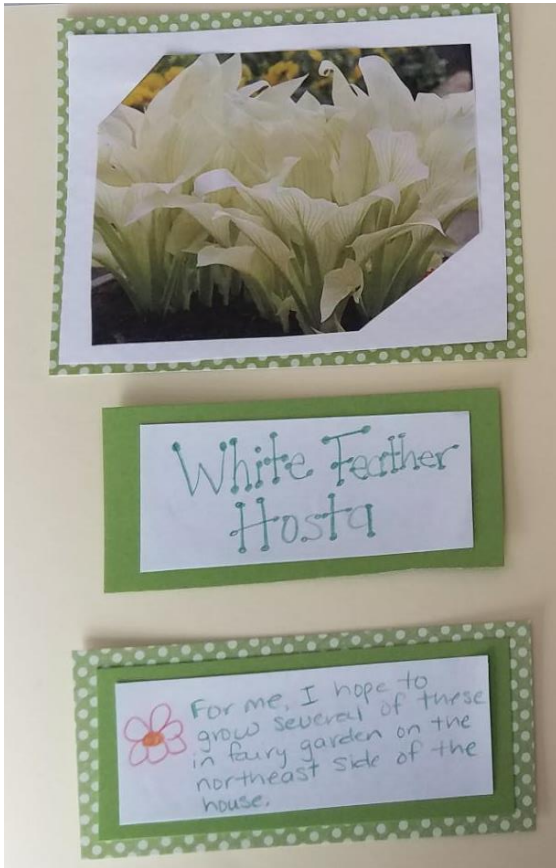
Description- rewording improves learning

Size & Zones

Growing Conditions

Why you chose this plant

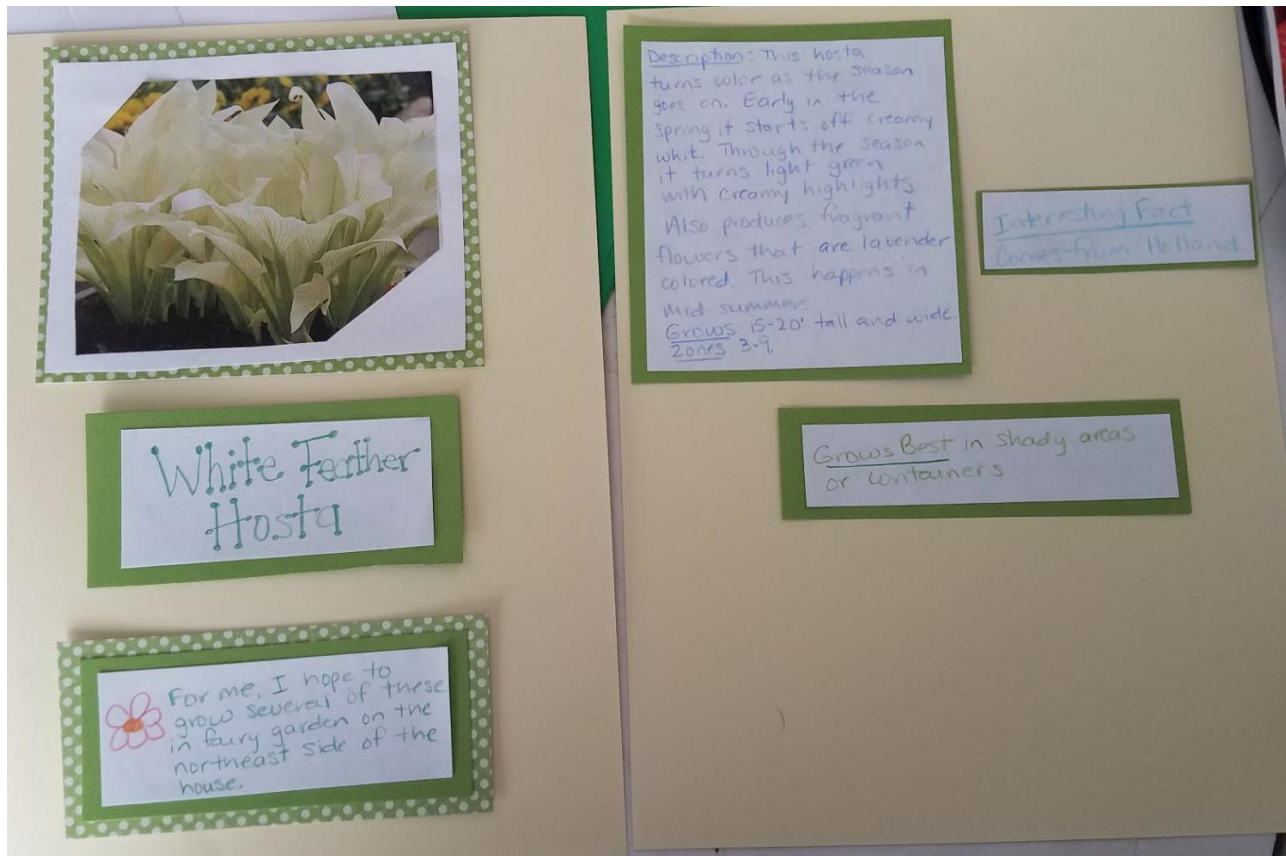
Anything else you want to include



Remove as much blank space as you can

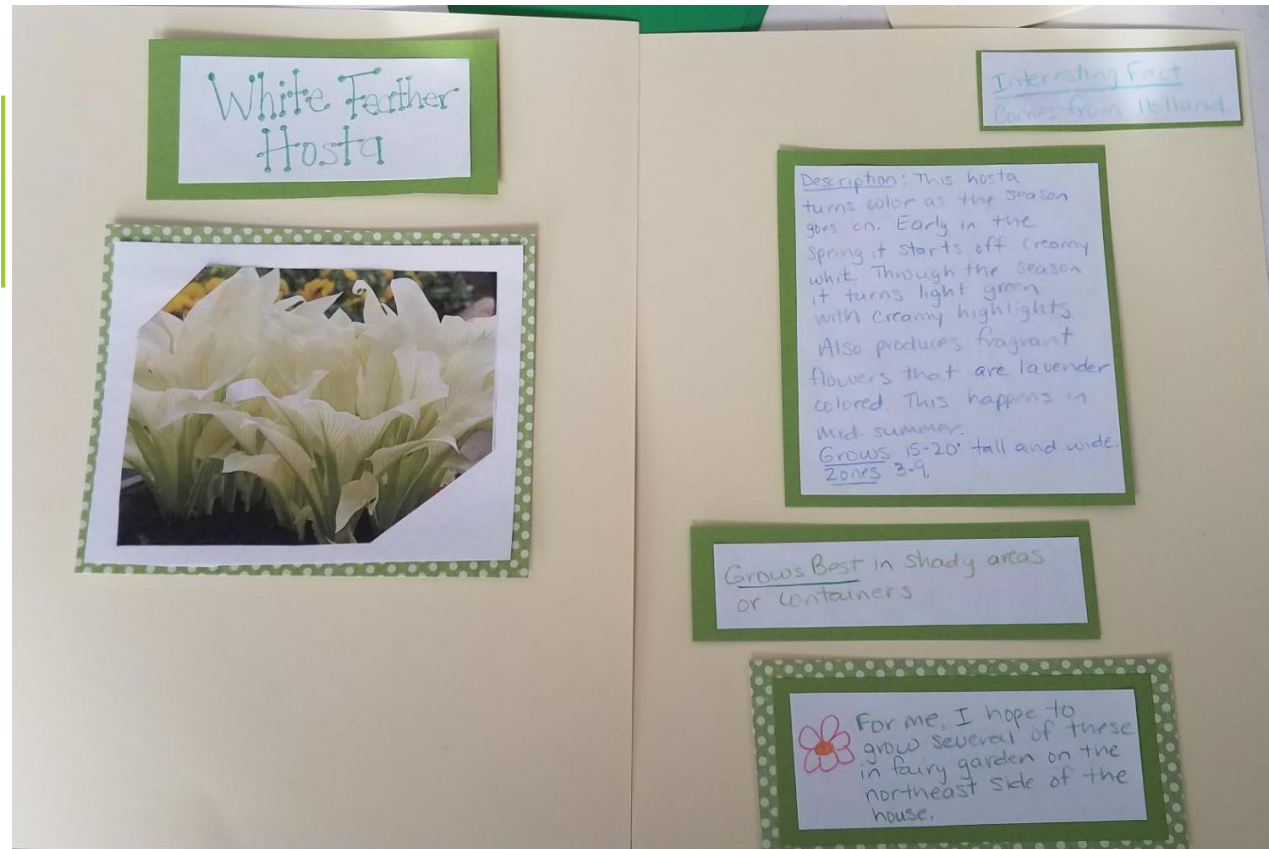
Layer colored papers beneath to create matted information & pictures

TRIM ALL PHOTOS AND INFORMATION



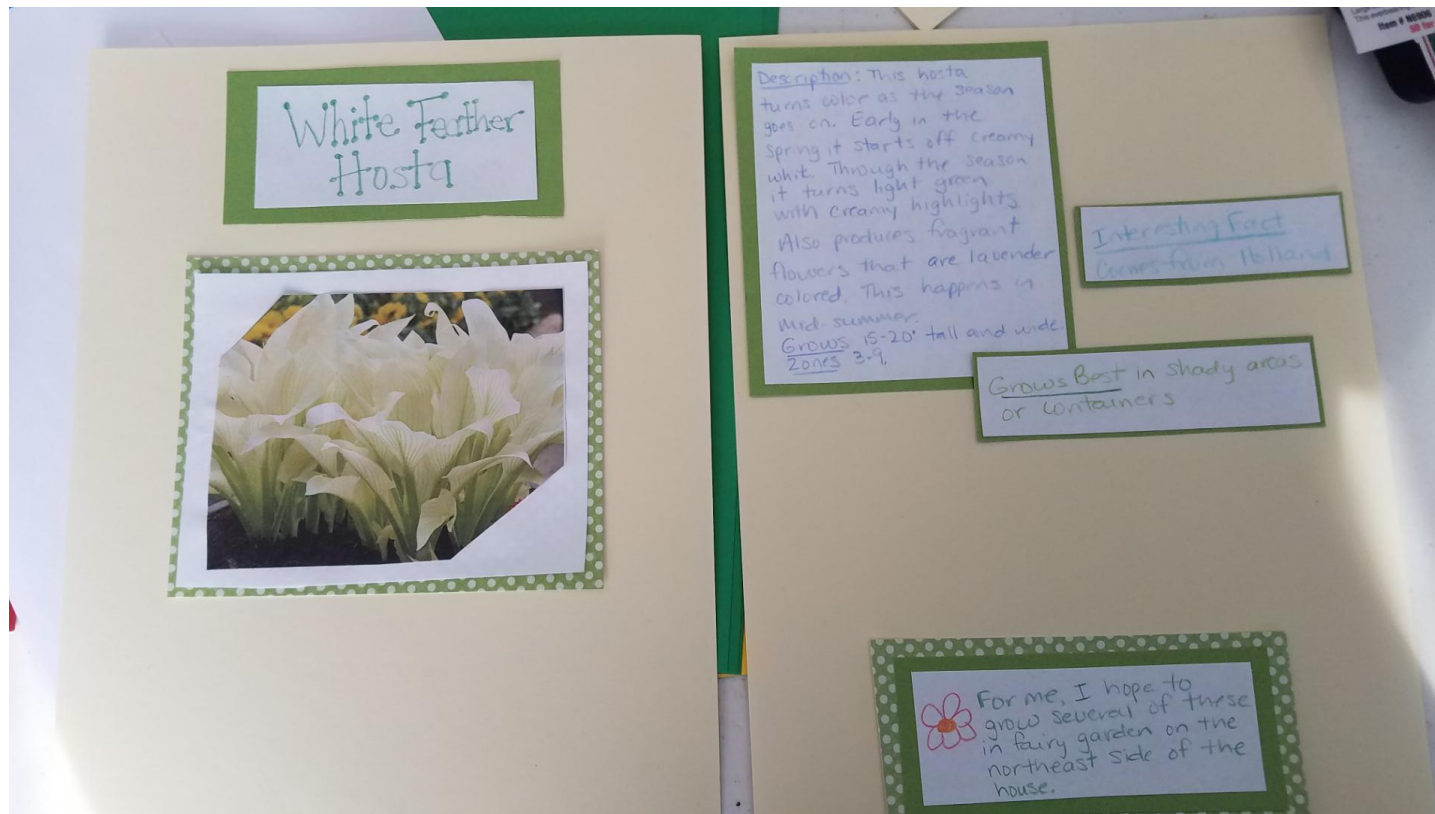
Move things around to get a sense of balance

PLAY AROUND WITH LAYOUT



Remember to save space if you are going to add more later

When ready, glue down

PLAY AROUND WITH LAYOUT



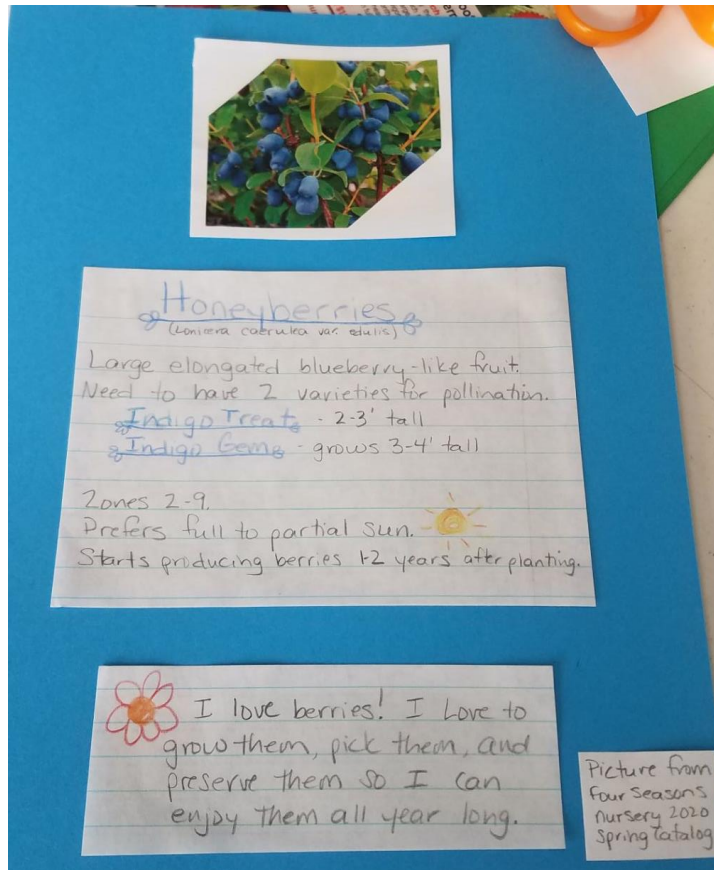
IDENTIFY THE SOURCE OF YOUR PHOTOS

Include the name of the catalog, year and season (when applicable).

If using photos you took, you date them and include that information on each individual page.

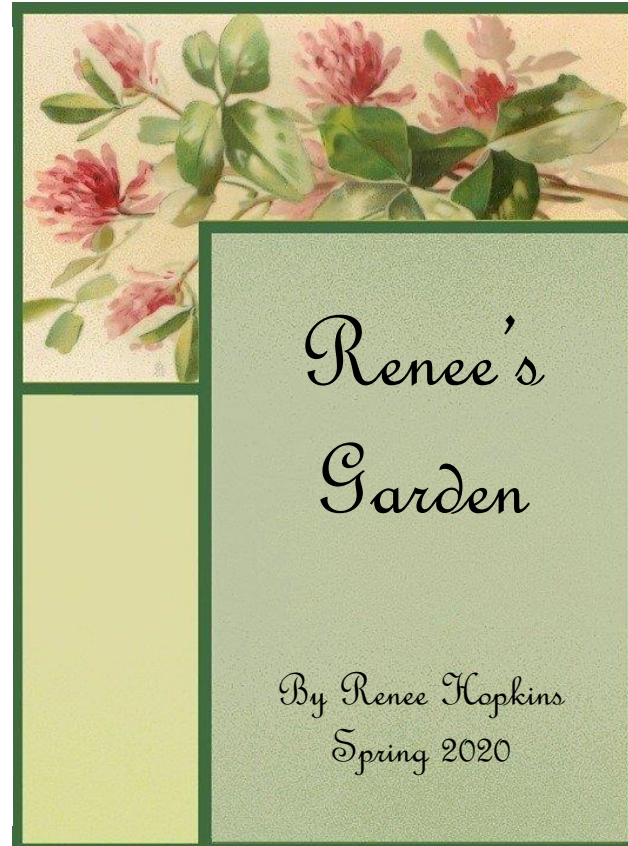
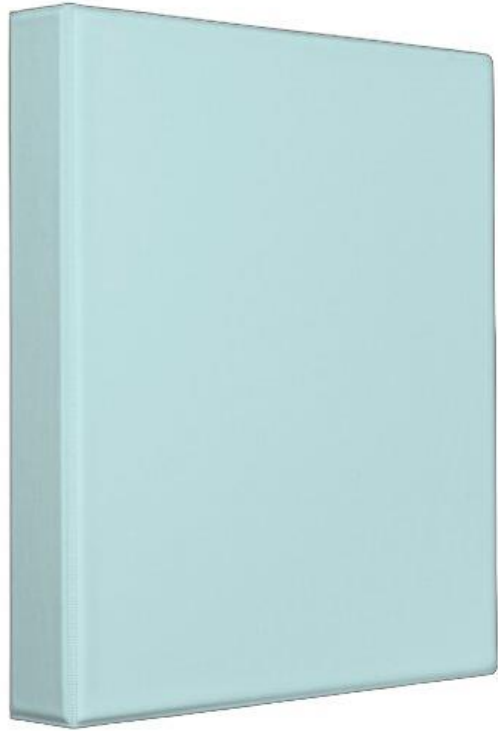
If using photos you found from somewhere, include where you got them and a date.

Also include the source of information about the plant if different than catalog.



If you have multiple sources, add the source to each page

INCLUDE SOURCE OF PHOTO/INFO



COMPILE ALL YOUR PAGES

Use a 3 ring binder

Create a cover- include a TITLE,
your NAME and the YEAR

Decorate as desired!

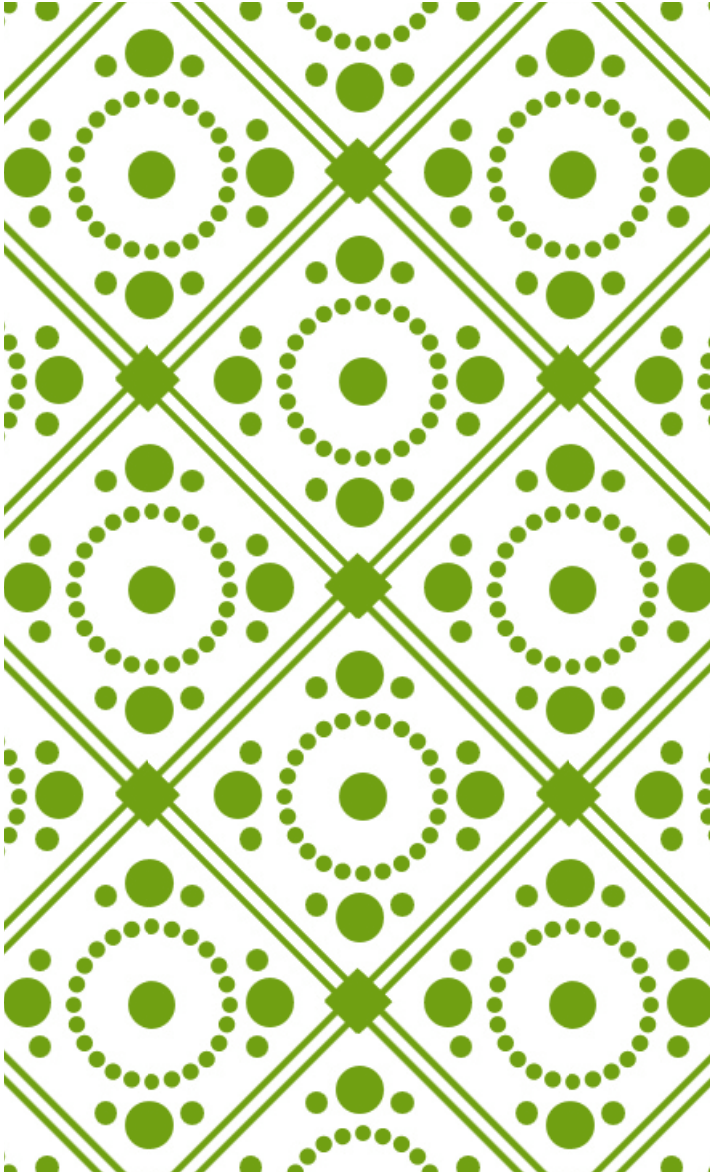
Page protectors are great!
