

ATTENTION ALL HEMLOCK FAIR 4-H ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

Pre-Fair Educational Activity Requirement

All Dairy & Livestock and Small Animal exhibitors exhibiting at the Hemlock Fair are **required to complete one 45-minute animal-related educational activity by July 1**st. Cloverbuds are exempt:

- This requirement is for all members exhibiting at least one of the following species: Rabbit, Cavy, Poultry (Fancy & Meat Birds), Dairy, Beef, Goat, Sheep, or Swine
- Only 1 activity required regardless of the number of species being exhibited
- Failure to complete this requirement on time will result in forfeit of all fair animal premiums for the species listed above
- An activity can include any of the following:
 - 1. Any Livingston County 4-H Animal Activity Night participated in during current 4-H Year
 - 2. Participation in the Livingston County 4-H Public Presentation Program (MUST be an animal-related presentation)
 - 3. Any county, regional, state or Cornell University-sponsored 4-H animal science activities
 - 4. Independent 4-H animal activity pre-approved by a 4-H educator. A completed Pre-Fair Educational Activity Form must be completed and submitted with this option. Form may be found at http://ccelivingstoncounty.org/resources/pre-fair-educational-activity-form. Examples may include researching an animal-related topic of interest, attending an animal show, participating in a hands-on animal experience with a knowledgeable adult, watching videos/presentations on raising/showing an animal, etc. Contact Mark or Jenn regarding one of these ideas or if you have one of your own.

New York State Guernsey Calf Scholarship

The Calf Scholarship Award Program is sponsored by the New York State Guernsey Breeders Association for the purpose of encouraging those who do not presently own Guernseys to become involved with the Guernsey Breed. A purebred Guernsey Calf will be awarded to the applicant who shows interest in the Guernsey breed and who has demonstrated the capabilities of developing the animal to its fullest potential. Applicant must be age 9 – 15 as of January 1st of the application year. You do not have to belong to 4 – H, FFA, or a breed club to participate.

Have you ever wondered what those crystal-like things in caves were?

Caves have stalactites and stalagmites that make formations over thousands of years. Stalactites hold tight to the ceiling of the cave and stalagmites are mighty and stand up on the cave floor.

Let's make our own cave formations!

Materials: 2 Jars

Water

Epsom Salts

String


Small Weights (i.e. Rocks or Fishing Sinkers)

Plate

Procedure:

- 1. Fill both jars with warm water and mix in Epsom salts until no more will dissolve.
- 2. Wet the string and tie a weight to each end. Drop one end of the string into each jar.
- 3. Put a plate between the two jars with the string hanging over the plate.
- 4. Let the stalactites and stalagmites begin! Make sure to check your cave every day to see if any have formed.
