Trip Name	4-H Age	Description	Qualifications
Cloverbud 2A Trip	5-7	A short day trip to a local entertainment venue, such as miniature golf or bowling. Trip dates vary according to location.	Participation in Public Presentations or Horse Communications And One other county event * <i>No need to apply – we keep track.</i>
3A Trip	8-18	A day-long educational and fun trip to a local attraction. The location is different each year. Previous trips include the Rochester Museum & Science Center, Strong Museum, & Corning Museum of Glass. Trip is usually in the fall.	Participation in Public Presentations or Horse Communications And Two other county events * <i>No need to apply – we keep track</i>
Tween Trip	9-12	A fun day-long trip to spend with other tween 4-H members from the county. Roller skating, amusement park, and other local attractions are potential locations. Trip dates vary according to location.	Must demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the <i>Project Summary Book</i> . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation are required.
STARR	13-18	A weekend retreat full of leadership development, team building, and workshops! Planned for and carried out by a teen committee from across the state. Trip is usually in April.	Must demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the <i>Project Summary Book</i> . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation are required.
Cornell Career Explorations	Grade 7+	A 3 day, 2 night trip to Cornell University where youth can experience a bit of college life by staying in college dorms, eating at the college cafeterias, and taking classes geared toward age and interest. Trip is usually in late June/early July.	Must demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the <i>Project Summary Book</i> . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation is required. <i>County pays 66% of expense, participant pays the balance.</i>
Capital Days	Ages 14+	A 3 day trip to the State Capital where participants gain a better understanding of NYS government, career opportunities, and meet and exchange ideas with State Legislators. Trip is usually held in May.	Must have an interest in government and demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the <i>Project Summary Book</i> . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation is required. <i>County pays 66% of expense, participant pays the balance.</i>
* Eligible County Events include: Produced in New York, Creative Fiber Arts Revue, Hippology (Horse), Horse Bowl, Fall Fundraiser, Spring Fundraiser, Hemlock Fair.			

Cobleskill Agri-Business Career Conference	Ages 14+	A 2 day trip to SUNY Cobleskill where participants tour the college and area agricultural businesses, and hear from select speakers. Trip is usually in October.	Must have interest in agricultural business and demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the Project Summary Book . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation is required. County pays 66% of expense, participant pays the balance.
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Award Name	4-H Ages	Description	Qualifications
First Year 4-H Award	8	A 4-H prize (t-shirt, hat or bag, etc.) given to any active first year 4-H member (not Cloverbud).	Must demonstrate active involvement in 4-H through the Project Summary Book . Trip Application & Leader Recommendation is required.

Over 50 Project Pins are available. Some common Project Pins awarded include Food & Nutrition, Arts & Crafts, Leadership, Community Service, Horse, Photography, Dog, and Rabbit.	Must have completed 2 years of work in a project area as reflected in the Project Summary Book , as well as related experiences (such as fair exhibits, bowl contests, judging teams, and teen leadership). Can apply for 2 pins per year, but not the same pin 2 years in a row. An Application and Recommendation are required.
Animal Science Project Record Awards	8+	Awards given to 4-H members with the most outstanding Animal Project Records or Market Animal Records.	Submission of the complete Animal Project Record. Blank Market Animal Project records are given at time of animal tag in. Record books for non-market animals and small animal species are available – contact the CCE Office.
Horsemen of the Year	8+	Recognizes members for their year round participation and achievement in the 4-H Horse Program. A certificate and plaque are awarded to the top 2 participants at three different levels of achievement.	Points are earned throughout the year during horse related activities, such as Hippology, Horse Bowl, Horse Communications, clinics, Horse Shows, etc. Details can be found in the Livingston County 4-H Horse Policy Guidebook on our website.
Outstanding 4-Her	16-18	This is a monetary scholarship of \$100 awarded to a senior level 4-H member who has demonstrated outstanding involvement in 4-H.	Must have been an active 4-H member for at least 5 years. A written essay, leader/parent recommendation, and application are required.
Russell B. Ace Memorial Scholarship	Grade 12	A \$1000 scholarship awarded to an active 4-H member who has demonstrated leadership skills and served his/her community through active participation in the 4-H Program.	Must be an active 4-H member for at least 5 years and a graduating high school senior planning to attend secondary education program resulting in a certificate or a degree. Applications are available on our website and are due in early May.
