

Constellations are pictures made up of stars. They were often named after items people were familiar with like animals or mythical people.


Constructing a Constellation

Materials:

8 ½ " x 11" White Paper 8 ½ " x 11" Black Construction Paper



Pencil Metal Pin Stars Cutouts Scissors Glue White Crayon



Procedure:

- Draw a picture of your constellation on the white paper. You may draw a constellation from one listed on the next page or create your own.
- 2. Line up your white and black papers. Using the metal pin, poke a hole through every corner of your design.
- 3. Cut out stars and glue one on every pin hole.
- 4. Connect the stars using a white crayon.


